



CTA Climate Justice Grant 2022-2023

About the Grant:

The CTA Climate Justice Grant has been established by the CTA to support teachers in promoting environmentally responsible teaching practices in Chilliwack. The grant is administered by the CTA Released Officers and is allocated by application and draw to a maximum of \$500.

Criteria:

The following criteria will be used to determine eligibility for the grant:

- Teacher initiatives for educational change in areas of climate justice teaching, such as acknowledging climate change can have differing social, economic, public health, and other adverse impacts on underprivileged populations. Advocates for climate justice are striving to have these inequities addressed head-on through long-term mitigation and adaptation strategies.
- The proposed project may be classroom-based or school-based, or it may involve the school and community.
- Applications may be based on new initiatives or projects that are currently underway.
- Applications that are innovative in nature will be considered prior to repeat proposals from schools or teachers.
- Grants may be used for the following but are not limited to these purposes: release time, materials, publicity, and communications.
- Grants are not provided for projects outside of Chilliwack or for school supplies, hardware, or materials that are the responsibility of the school district or Ministry of Education.
- Projects should be innovative, actively involve students, collaborative and have a major impact on learners.
- Projects should address Climate Justice within the context of BC's curriculum, while providing a framework with which to explore modern, social and environmental issues, such as our industrial food system, consumerism and waste, transportation, and the development of a green economy.

Process:

Applications must be submitted to the CTA by December 15th. Applications will be reviewed by the CTA Released Officers. Successful applications will be placed into a draw to be held at the January General Meeting. Applicants must be present at the meeting to receive the grant.

Application Guidelines:

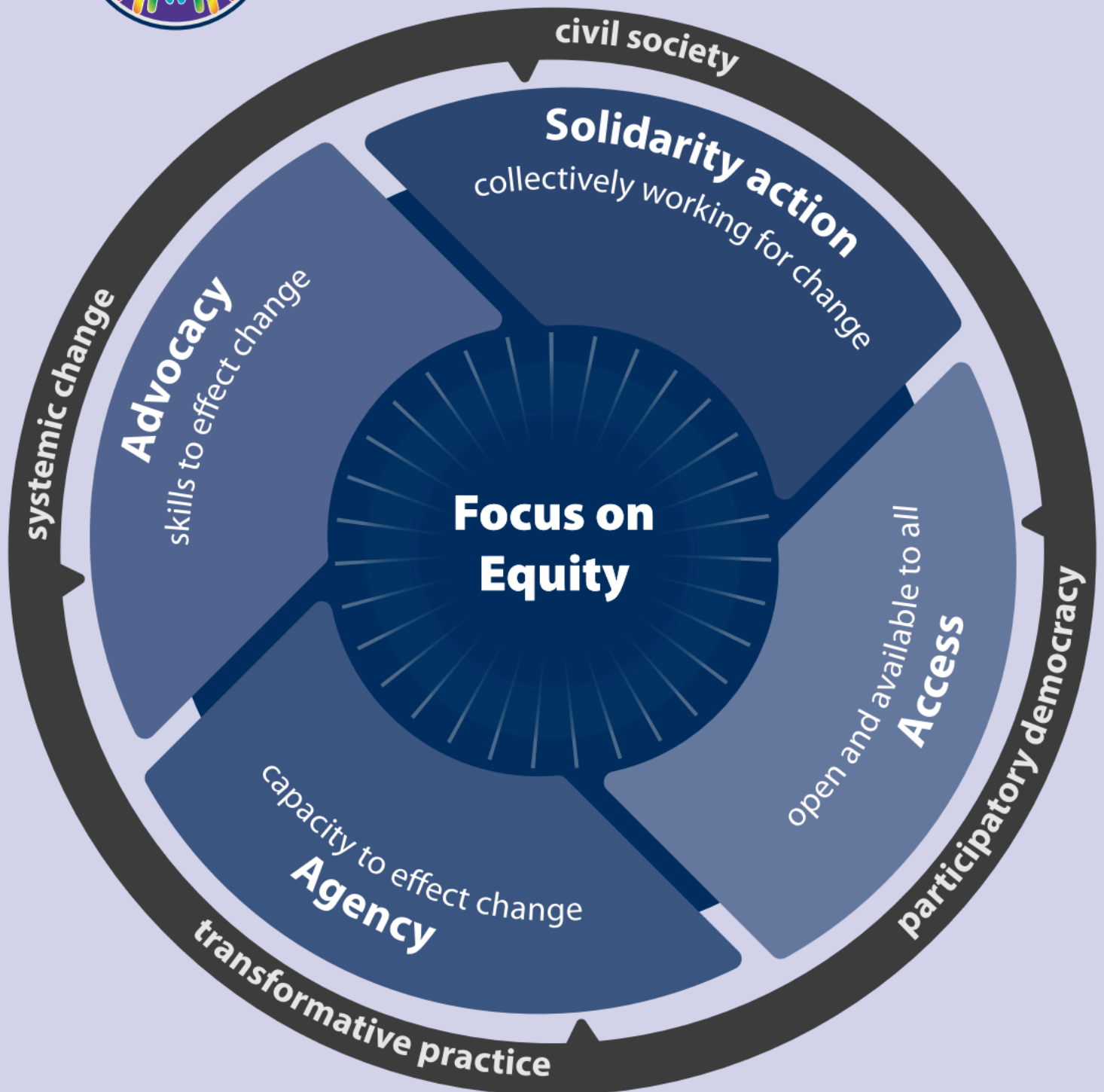
The application form must be fully completed and include:
